1. Introduction

This Technical Circular adopts the position statement published by the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA) for ***Reporting of Histopathology and Non-Gynaecological Cytopathology Specimens outside the Laboratory***

Accredited or Applicant facilities to ISO 15189 *Medical Laboratories - Requirements for quality and competence* must ensure compliance with this Technical Circular from the date of publication.

2. Background

In June 2014 the RCPA updated its position statement for *Reporting of Histopathology and Non-Gynaecological Cytopathology Specimens outside the Laboratory*. The RCPA position statement includes details of off-site activities that must be reviewed when reporting occurs outside the laboratory.

3. Policy

NATA has adopted the requirements of the RCPA position statement. This policy shall apply from March 2015 to all facilities accredited to ISO 15189 *Medical Laboratories - Requirements for quality and competence*.
